



CRSOK Awarded 'Distinction' and Expanding Services

CRSOK was awarded a 3-year extension to operate as a CMHC with “distinction” - the greatest extension that can be granted. CRSOK also received a temporary permit to operate as a Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinic (CCBHC). Designed and funded both by the Federal and State government, the overarching goal of a CCBHC is to improve access to high-quality care for all people, regardless of their health insurance coverage or ability to pay.

To receive full certification, CRSOK is implementing the staff, leadership, and infrastructure changes critical and necessary to completely support this integrated model. CRSOK has begun the process of evolving and expanding to a person-centered, family-centered, trauma-informed, and recovery-oriented model of care that integrates physical and behavioral health services to serve the whole person.

To achieve this level of holistic care, a CCBHC requires nine different areas of service, seven of which CRSOK already provides! The only two service areas not currently provided are crisis services and Primary Care PCP screening and monitoring. In the interim, CRSOK is establishing a formal contract/arrangement with local third-party providers. Moving forward, CRSOK is developing ways to improve and expand our crisis services, as well as our capacity to provide Primary Care PCP screening and monitoring.

In this proven and successful model of care, CRSOK staff will become one facet of a multi-disciplinary team all working to service the physical, mental, and socioeconomic needs of that client. The client's overall success and benchmarked improvement now drives the measurement of our services.
